[The above Arms are recorded in Ulster Office as appertaining to the descendants of my great-great-grandfather William Fuller (p. 285). The Crest, a horse, is clearly shewn on the seal of a letter from George Fuller, Speaker to the Council of Cork (p. 282), dated 19 November 1754, now in my possession ; but the Canadian Branch, descended from Major Thomas Richard Fuller (p. 285), uses a martlet. Presumably this martlet was, at some time, rightly adopted as the mark of cadency of a fourth son, and was subsequently erroneously continued as a crest. It appears on an old tray in my possession. There is, at Mount Leader, a gold snuff-box (which I have not seen), presented by the Grand Jury of Cork to my great-grandfather Thomas Fuller, Treasurer of the County (p. 286), whose wife Ann was daughter of Mary Leader of Mount Leader.]

## Pedigree of Fuller of Cork, Kerry, and (?) Halsted.\*

Richard Fuller of the parish of St. Finn Barre, City of Cork. Will proved 1642. Overseers, Rev. Thomas Bennett and the testator's wife Mary. Witnesses, Thomas Bennett, Benjamin Gribble, and Mary Fuller.

Mary . . . , mentioned in her husband's will.

Thomas Fuller of Ingatestone, born at Halsted. Will proved 1 July 1635.

Samuel Fuller of Halsted. Will proved 2 October 1635. Mentions his son John, "if he doth ever happen to come over again," which phrase would seem to point to Ireland, as it would hardly be used in reference to a foreign country.

Agnes. Will proved 14 June 1638.

Elizabeth, mentioned as youngest daughter and as sole executrix in her father's will.

A child, mentioned in father's will as then, 1642, unborn.

John Fuller, 3rd son, was probably the same who held lands in Kerry by Knight's service from the Crown (Inquisition No. 59, Charles 1st, co. Kerry, calendered by Record Commissioners 1818). See FULLER of Glashnacree, co. Kerry, in Burke's "Landed Gentry."

Barbara. She was living in 1700 on 20 February when her jointure was secured in her son's mar. settlement.

Richard Atkins of Firville, co. Cork. See older editions of Burke's "Landed Gentry." He was living in 1702.

Maurice Fuller, joined his father in sale of lands to Teige Moriarty 1635. See Burke's "Landed Gentry," FULLER of Glashnacree.

Richard Purcell of Kilbrin. Will proved at Cloyne 7 June 1733. He was uncle of Ann Purcell, wife of Thomas Fuller. (See p. 286.) = Barbara, youngest da., living 28 June 1782.

John Fuller, mentioned in his father's will, born about 1632.

Richard Fuller, mentioned in his father's will.

Ezekiel Fuller, mentioned in his father's will.

Welshin, da., mentioned in her father's will.

Ellinor, da. and coheir of Thomas Hodder of Ballea Castle (by his wife Ellinor Kingsmill), High Sheriff of Cork 1697; m. 1713 at St. Mary's, Shandon. See marriage bonds, Cork and Ross. One of the bondsmen was Robert Pellican. (See note on p. 283.)

 William Fuller of Donoughmore and Donoughbeg, leased from Laurence, Lord Barrymore, March 1696. See Equity Exchequer Bill, Fuller *v.* O'Hea, June 1748, William Austen acting as Attorney. See the Austin connection below. It is almost certain that this William Fuller was grandson of Richard who died 1642, but which son of Richard was William's father I have not been able to determine, as the Parish Records are lost from April 1665 to January 1708.

Elinor, married John Sealy, J.P., and had issue. See Burke's "Landed Gentry," SEALY of Richmond.

George Fuller, admitted to Freedom of Cork 1718; elected to Council 1727; Mayor of Cork 1734; Alderman for parishes of St. Finn Barre and St. Nicholas, Cork, 1736; Sheriff of Cork 1740 (and possibly the Sheriff of 1719). Will proved 1745, in which he names his wife Catherine and his sons William and George.

Catherine, named in Chancery Bill 11 Feb. 1758 as wife of George Fuller and as one of the daughters of John Austin of Renendendle, co. Cork, by his 1st wife. (John Austin is also named therein as grandfather to William Fuller.) Married to George Fuller 1702 (Marriage Licences, Diocese of Cork and Ross).

Another da. of John Austin named in Chancery Bill 11 Feb. 1758 as intermarried with Joseph Austin (probably her cousin).

B "Thomas Fuller of Fuller Park, Alderman, died 1741." (This note from an old newspaper. The property known as Fuller Park was also called Willow Hill, so I presume above Thomas to be of this branch, which owned that property.)

Emanuel Fuller, mentioned in Council Books of Cork as son of Alderman Fuller and brother of the Mayor of Cork for 1739. In list of Freemen 1789. (Note.—Letter signed by W<sup>m</sup> Fuller "for my brother Eman: Fuller," dated 26 May 1748, in my possession.)

George Fuller, signs as George Fuller, junior, Committee Report 1736; Common Speaker to the Council of Cork; mentioned as G. F., *junior*, in 1769 (*i.e.*, junior, not to his father, who was dead, but to another George Fuller); named in Equity Exchequer Bill 13 June 1749 as "Mercer of Cork," who succeeded Joseph Austin in the same business; died about 1769, at which date a pension is granted to the widow of George Fuller. See note to plate of Coat of Arms.

William Fuller, named in Chancery Bill 1758 as brother-in-law to Samuel Daunt and as grandson to John Austin of Renendendle, also in Equity Exchequer Bill 14 November 1761 as of Willow Hill, co. Cork, and as bound to Joseph Austin for debts incurred by his brother (not named), and again in Equity Exchequer Bill 17 June 1763 as executor with Emanuel Fuller and Elizabeth Daunt to Samuel Daunt. Will 25 Aug. 1778 as of Willow Hill, in which he mentions his nephews George and William Daunt, his brother Emanuel, and his nephew William Fuller.

Mary, da. of Francis Daunt; marriage licence 1733, Diocese of Cork and Ross.

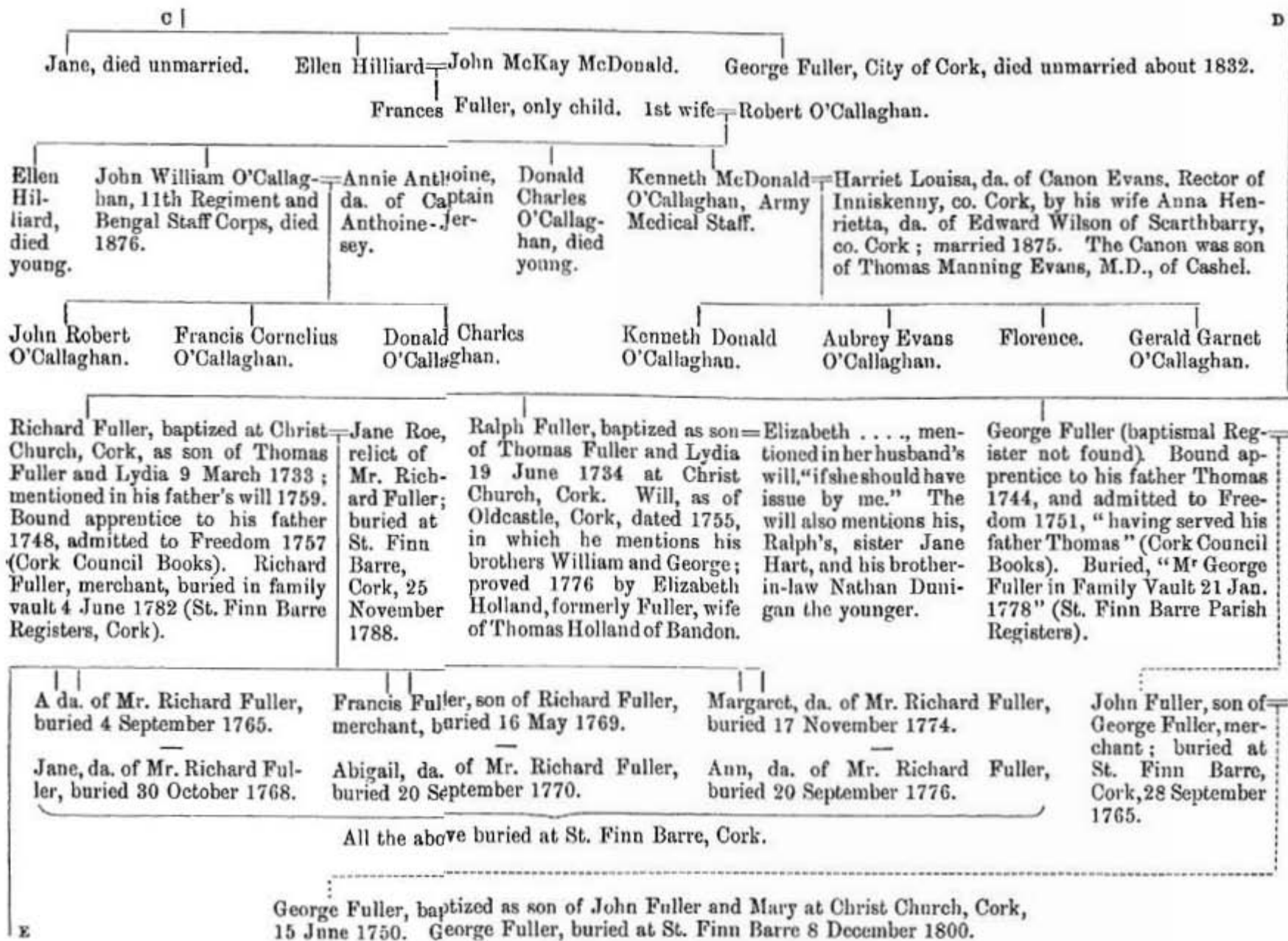

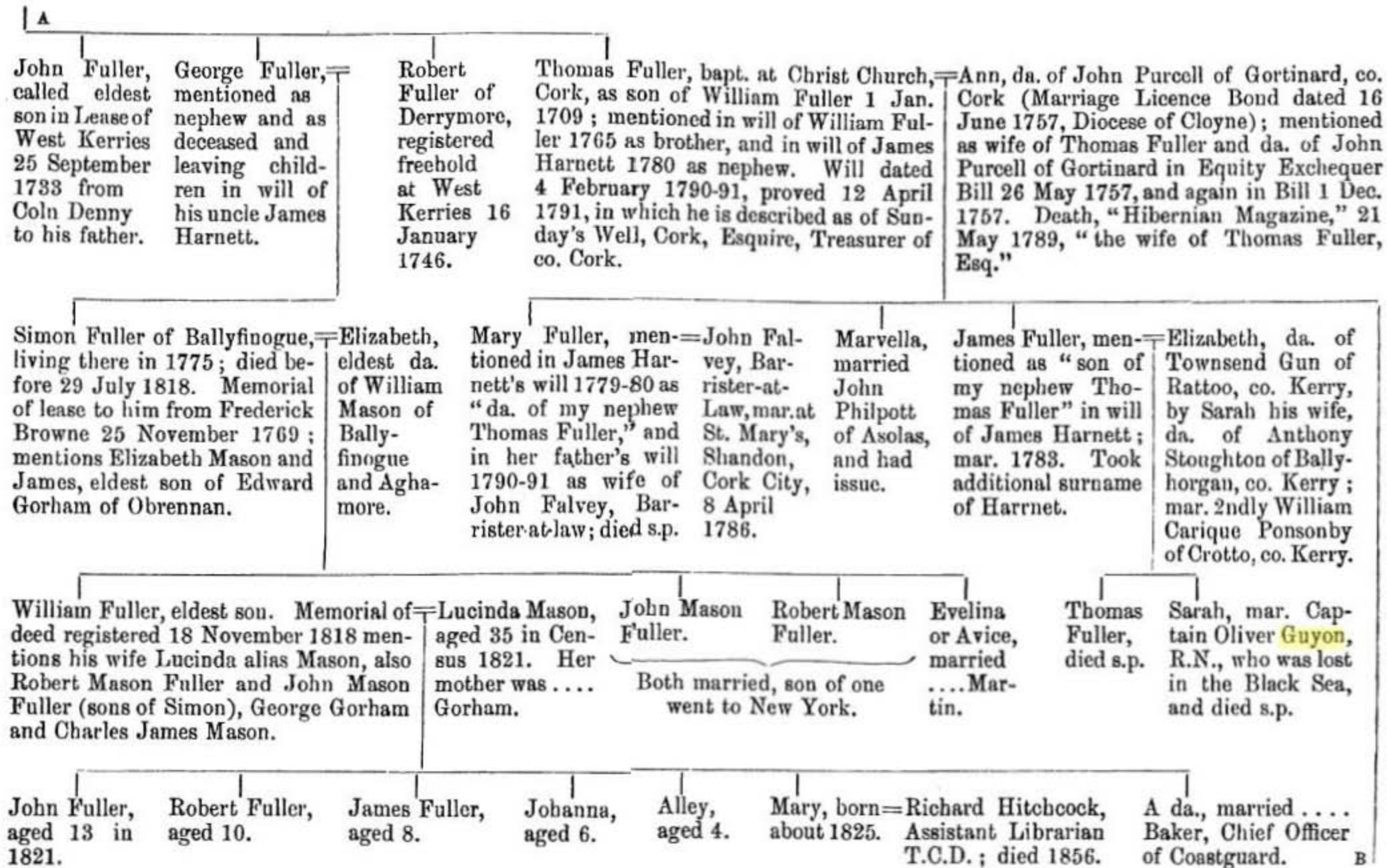
<p><b>E</b></p> <p>Thomas Richard Fuller, baptized at Christ Church, Cork, as son of Richard Fuller and Jane 19 May 1765; married to Mary Fuller at St. Nicholas, Cork, 1 July 1790; mentioned in Mary Fuller's will 1803 as her husband, Captain Thomas Richard Fuller, 41st Regt. Major Thomas Richard Fuller married 2ndly Mary, da. of Captain England, and was father of Right Rev. Thomas B. Fuller, D.D., Bishop of Niagara, and ancestor of the Canadian branch. See Burke's "Colonial Gentry," also note to plate of Coat of Arms.</p>	<p>Mary Fuller. Kerry, Milltown Cellar, Fanstown, two fields in Liberty of Cork, Bally Gronan, etc., in common with his brother Thomas (Equity Exchequer Bills, 18 June 1774 and 19 December 1780).</p>	<p>Ellen, da. of Robert Hilliard of Lis-trum; mentioned in her husband's will, to whom he leaves Fanstown. (In Foster's "Noble and Gentle Families," vol. v. (1887), p. 80, all the descendants of this marriage are pretty accurately given. John Fuller of Lee-mount, co. Cork, mentioned in James Harnett's will 1790-91, as "son of my nephew Thomas Fuller;" took the additional surname of Harnett March 1783.

Mary, da. of Noblett Rogers of Lota, co. Cork, by Mary his wife, da. of the Ven. Michael Davies, Archdeacon of Cloyne.

Edward Fuller, mentioned as "son of my nephew Thomas Fuller" in will of James Harnett; admitted to Freedom of Cork 1788; Captain in the "Old Kerry" Regiment; died October 1827; buried in Fuller and Harnett vault, Shandon, Cork. (Married at Ardfert Church, co. Kerry, Edward Fuller, Esq., to Miss Blennerhassett, eldest da. of Rev. John Blennerhassett, Rector of Tralee. "Dublin Chronicle," 2 August 1791.)

Elizabeth, da. of the Rev. John Blennerhassett, Rector of Tralee, by Louisa his wife, only surviving child of Captain Thomas Goddard, of the Earl of Rothe's Regiment, by Mary his wife, eldest da. of William Mullins of Burnham, co. Kerry, and sister to Thomas, 1st Lord Vintry; born 1772. (Captain Goddard was son of Rev. Thomas Goddard, Canon of Windsor, by his wife Ann, da. of Rev. John Beale.)

Noblett=Frances, da. of Edmund L'Estrange Harnett, died s.p. King's County, by Henrietta his wife, sister of Colonel Henry Piesley L'Estrange of Moystown, King's County; died 19 January 1872.

1. Thomas Harnett Fuller of Glashnacree, co. Kerry, born 1806; died 9 November 1886. He married 2ndly Eliza, da. of Richard Harris Purcell of Annabella Park, near Mallow, co. Cork, leaving no issue by her.

Frances Diana, 3rd da. of Francis Christopher Bland of Derryquin Castle, co. Kerry, J.P., D.L., by Lucinda his wife, da. of Arthur Bastable Herbert of Brewsterfield, same co., by his wife Barbara, da. of Maurice Fitzgerald, Knight of Kerry; mar. 3 Dec. 1832; died 23 April 1872. 1st wife.
